The Antigonish Women's Association is now into its second year and reports a most active and successful year since its inception in May of 1983.

The Association was formed when a group of interested women recognized the need to promote awareness and understanding of women's issues among women and the general public. Membership within the Association numbers approximately 150, made up of women of all ages, needs and interests.

The first major project of Association was establish the Antigonish Women's Resource Center which opened on December 12, 1983, at 222 Main Street. This was made possible through funding from Secretary of State Department, Women's Programs. Because of the resounding success of the Center and its future potential further funding was received last month when Allan J. MacEachen, Member of Parliament for the area, visited the Center and presented AWA president Vicki MacLean with a cheque for the current year, affirming government sup-port for the work being done.

The Center, which is staffed by co-ordinator Oona Landry and office manager Betty MacLean, meets a very real need in the community. It provides the physical space and supportive environment for women to meet formally and informally to share and exchange information and ideas. It enables women to involved in become various activities at the Center which include guest speakers, workshops films on topics of special interest to women.

Through the Women's Resource Center, the AWA has developed a network of women throughout town and county. The popular AWA newsletter "AWARE" consists of news, information, calendar of events, book reviews, etc., and goes out to all members approximately ten times a year.
