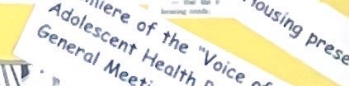

The survey found that many low-income households are struggling to find affordable housing, and that the current housing market is not meeting their needs. The survey also found that many low-income households are facing other challenges, such as food insecurity and lack of access to social services. The survey results will be used to inform the development of a new housing strategy for the community. 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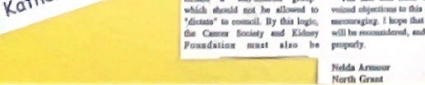

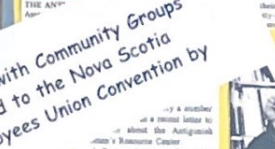
