Status of Women Council

The chair of the Advisory Council on the Status of Women is encouraging concerned Nova Scotians to contact their elected representatives about cuts to women' shelters.

"We were totally shocked by the decision to cut \$890,000 from the budgets of transition houses, women's centres and men's treatment programs," advisory council chair Rita Warner stated. "And once a decision like this is announced in a budget, it's a major challenge to get a reversal."

The advisory council urges all concerned Nova Scotians to express their opinions on the situation.

"The council's position is clear: the cuts should be reversed," Warner stated.

Nova Scotians can make their views and voices heard in any of several

ways. They can call their MLA, e-mail or write to Peter Christie, Minister of Community Services, or contact the Advisory Council on the Status of Women.
