The school's student government recently donated a variety of toys, games and other Christmas items, along with a monetary contribution, to the Antigonish Women's Resource Centre (AWRC) as part of its own version of casual Fridays.

"It is something that students and staff have been doing for the last couple of years," Grade 10 student Sarah MacNeil said.

Each Friday, students pay one quarter for permission to don a cap or hat, while teachers and staff members who wear jeans toss one dollar in the collection.

Prior to Christmas, the casual day collection is used to make the holidays a little brighter for local families. Along with the AWRC – this year's recipient - the Pomquet school community has "adopted a family" and made contributions to Christmas Daddies.

"It means a lot to all of us, and we hope it helps some families in our communities," Katherine said.

Before turning over their piece of Christmas cheer to the AWRC, the items were displayed in the school.
