Emily Lindin is a Harvard graduate, PhD candidate, and suicide prevention activist living in Southern California. The UnSlut Project began when Emily, as an adult, chose to publish her own middle school diaries online in response to learning about the suicides of several teen girls who had experienced similar slut-shaming and bullying. Her diaries have been read by hundreds of thousands of people and have brought much attention to the practice of slut-shaming and the harassment of young women.

Compelled by the stories of girls like Rehteah Parsons, Amanda Todd, and Audrie Pott, Emily has created The Unslut Project, and "Unslut: A Documentary Film" as well as advocating through multiple forms of media and public awareness campaigns.
