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In April of 2013, 17 year old Rehtaeh Parsons died after attempting to take her own life. She and her family attributed her death to incessant harassment and bullying she experienced both at school and online after pictures of a sexual assault were shared among her peer group.

Rehtaeh's tragic story has touched the lives of many across this country and around the world, and moved the province to improve our responses to sexual violence and cyber-harassment, leading to the first ever provincial sexual violence strategy.

The Antigonish Women's Resource Centre & Sexual Assault Services Association, in partnership with the STFX Human Rights and Equity office will be screening the documentary *No Place to Hide: The Rehteah Parsons* story as part of our sexual assault awareness month activities. The screening will be followed with a panel discussion.
