

the conference with a new sense of empowerment, thanks to the many excellent workshops; the encounters with other like minded women, and the very informative panel discussion which initiated the Conference on opening night. The panel members were faced with a monumental task should they have attempted to address all of the issues contained under the general theme of the panel: "Priority Issues for Women".

So, they decided that each would take one priority issue and confine herself to a discussion of that particular issue in the limited time at her disposal. Debi Forsyth-Smith chose as her topic, "The Economic Disparity Between Men and Women in the Work force Today". She painted quite a bleak picture of today's situation for women in the work force. She pointed out that 3 out of 4 women working outside the home today, out of necessity, are either single parents or separated or divorced, and are bringing up children. And more often than not such women are simply eeking out a bare subsistence for themselves and their children. The minimum wage, which is quite generally the wage earned by these women, amounts to about \$7,000 a year, a figure which is well below the poverty level.

Debi pointed out to the conferees a variety of statistics and salaries. It was noted that generally men's earning poweer is substantially more than womens. One example she gave was that generally men's earning power is substantially more than womens. One example she gave was that

Which, of course, tells us much about the priorities of governments and other employers when dealing with women.

The second panel member, Francine Cosman, took a somewhat philosophical approach to the topic of communication which she chose as her priority issue. She dwelt upon the necessity of communications as the key to changing the situation addressed by Debi Forsyth-Amtih. Francine stressed the fact that women must empower themselves by communicating their concerns in clear language. Women must set aside their differences if they are to affect any kind of change in their own situation. Women must believe in their power to change attitudes if things are going to change appreciably for the better.

Women must get in touch with their M.P.'s and MLA's and make them aware of the plight of so

many women today. Women must insist that legislation passed in their favour should be promulgated, and should not be allowed to be ignored by employers and by society as a whole. Tokenism must be done away with and women must learn that they have inalienable rights which must no longer be ignored. To accomplish this, women must begin to communicate first of all with other women. Only then can they enjoy the power necessary to take on the other elements in society which are inimical to the cause of women.

Alexa McDonough, the third panel member, concurred with all of the remarks made by Debi Forsyth-Smith and Francine Cosman. She, too, stressed the importance of communications as expressed in lobbying government members and others. However, she took a somewhat different approach in that she laid great importance on women being present in the "corridors of power". She felt that if women are to progress, then they have to be immediately involved where the decisions are being made, where the legislation is being formed.

And so she urged more women to get involved in the political scene, not in the traditional roles of tea makers, envelope stuffers, etc., but to offer as condidates for any one of the existing political parties.

Alexa finds it a disgrace the only 3 women are now in the Nova Scotia legislature and posed the question, "How can women expect a fair shake from that preponderantly male "enclave"?" She quoted Agnes McPhail who, 62 years ago (1925) made the following plea in a speech in parliament.

The preservation of the home is at stake. Economic freedom demands

a single standard for men and women in the work force. To bring this about it is important that women be elected to government positions. Only then will lobbying

positions. Unly then will lowly any be effective. There must be a way to share power."

Society is very much in need of a redefinition of power. And it is imperative that women shall be in on the process when this redefinition is taking place.

The final speaker on the panel was Sylvia Gold. She attempted to place the matter of women's lack of power in the historical context. She pointed out how in 1867 women did not have the right to vote and they could not hold public office. In 1919, they obtained the franchise, after bitter struggle and valiant efforts on the part of women. In the 1920's, women were given the privilege of being classed as "persons", with all the rights and privileges included therein!! Yet, in the 1980's, the number of women holding any kind of responsible offices within the various governments is comparatively miniscule. When the Charter of Rights was about to be accepted by the federal government and the provincial premiers in 1981-81, this illustrious body of men was quite ready to pass the Charter without any concern for the rights of women and native peoples. No too well known is the story of the magnificent fight put up by the National Action Council, a group of enlightened women who took on Goliath and won! That struggle is one of the best



Recent studies have shown that proper diet and excercise can help to curtail some of the more unpleasant symptoms of menopause. "Ginseng taken as a tea or in tablet form has proven to be very effective for some women," stated Ms. Sweet. Salt intake must also be monitored during this period in a women's life. Dressing in layers, wearing lower necklines, and choosing cottons can reduce the unpleasantness of "hot flashes." Proper rest and relaxation is important to avoid becoming overtired and irritable. 





POWER P

Women are taught to be uncomfortable with the idea of having power. (It is as unladylike as being physically strong!) Often when we "do what is expected of us" we abdicate our power almost entirely.

I always arranged my life around Larry. When we were first together I was beginning a career in teaching. But soon he got a job offer in another city, and so we moved there. Then he wanted to have children, which I didn't really care about. But he wanted them badly, so it seemed all right to me. Then we moved again, this time to a fancy house in a fancy suburb, but I had no car—he took it—and I was quite lonely. The children became the center of my life, and I loved them and my husband deeply. Several times I thought of returning to school part time to get my certificate. But Larry was not willing for the house and the children to fall on his shoulders. And he said he was glad to support us, which I think he really was. Then, one day when the children were still quite young (our son was not even a year old), I learned something that terrified me...that for more than a year Larry had been having affairs with other women. They were all women whom he met in his job as a supervisor, professional women, very bright and competent and unattached and ten years younger than I was.

When I confronted him, he said that he found me dull, always talking about the house and the children—of course, since that was my world!—and that these other women were far more interesting, as they had professional lives and were more worldly and more knowledgeable than I was about things which interested him in his work. He did not say, but I think it is true, that he also hated my asking him to be more involved with the children and the house. He ran to these women whenever I criticized him, looking for the things in them which he discouraged me from developing in myself. When I was younger, I did not see any problem with my shaping my life around Larry. Now I know I have paid a very high price.


